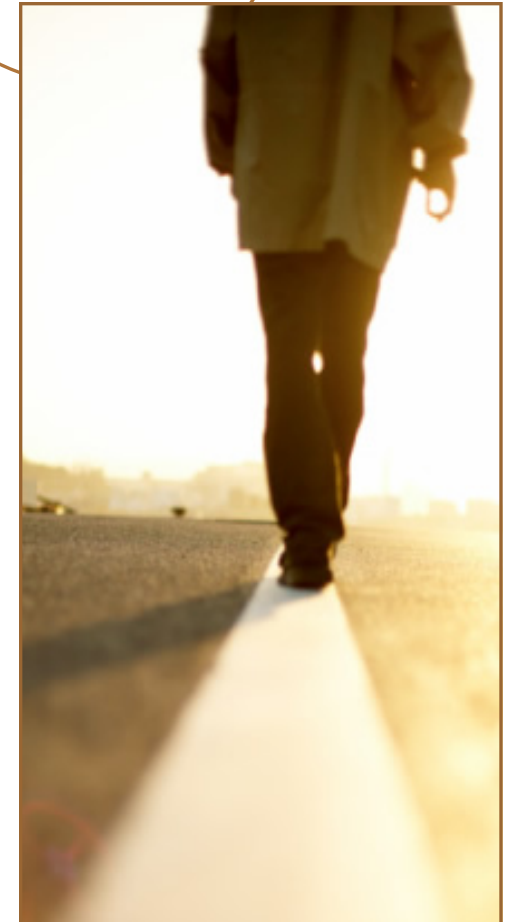

*For incarcerated individuals, 18 years and older, with Substance Misuse or co-occurring Substance Misuse and Mental Health Disorders.*

# JAIL BASED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

*Who is Eligible?*

*Centennial Mental Health Center*, in conjunction with Logan County Sheriff's Office (partnering with Cheyenne, Elbert, Kit Carson, Lincoln, Morgan, Phillips, Sedgwick, Washington and Yuma counties) has been awarded a sizeable grant from the Colorado Division of Behavioral Health to provide Jail Based Behavioral Services in facilities throughout Centennial's ten northeastern Colorado counties.



The JBBS program funds assessment and treatment services for inmates in County Jails who are experiencing Substance Misuse or co-occurring Substance Misuse and Mental Health Disorders.



## *Goal of Jail Based Behavioral Services*

The goal of the JBBS Program is to provide evidence based behavioral health services to inmates while assuring continuity of care within the community after release from incarceration. This approach is an effective strategy towards:

- Reducing the length of incarceration for individuals with behavioral health challenges;
- Decreasing recidivism and re-incarceration rates.

## *Inmates will be equipped with:*

- a seamless transition to out-patient treatment;
- opportunities for successful re-entry, and
- continuation of services with Centennial Mental Health Center in the communities to which they are released.

Incarcerated individuals, 18 years of age and older who are experiencing Substance Misuse or Substance Misuse with co-occurring Mental Health Disorders are eligible for services and assistance with JBBS.

## *What Services Are Available?*

- Screening and Assessment for eligibility to the program (Note: screening activities may be provided via secure video-teleconferencing in some locations).
- Treatment Groups provided on a weekly basis that are evidenced based and curriculum driven. Areas of focus will be substance misuse, mental health concerns and offender re-entry.
- Transitional Case Management Services, provided by the Criminal Justice Clinical Specialist. Areas of intervention include access to:
  - physical health care,
  - behavioral health care,
  - employment,
  - education/training,
  - housing, and
  - benefit acquisition.
- Interagency Collaborations, to promote a proactive approach in reducing recidivism through direct communication with referral sources and courts.
