

Centennial Mental Health Center, Inc. (CMHC) is committed to providing essential behavioral health services in a safe environment for our clients, visitors and staff members. In an effort to reduce the spread of the COVID-19 virus, CMHC is screening each person entering our buildings with two questions and providing a temperature scan to insure individuals are not running a fever over 100.0.

For clients and visitors entering any CMHC building, front desk support staff will first require 6 foot social distancing and ask the following questions:

1. Do you have any Flu-like or COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough or difficulty breathing?
2. Have you had direct contact with somebody diagnosed with COVID-19?

If the client or visitor answers yes to either question they will be asked to leave the building and return home. If the client or visitor remains symptom free for greater than 24 hours, they can seek re-entry the next day.

If the client or visitor answers no to both questions, their temperature will be taken, if it is below 100.0 they will be allowed to remain in the building. However if their temperature is at or above 100.0 they will be asked to leave the building and contact their PCP for instructions/care. If a client/visitor remains without a fever for greater than 24 hours without fever-reducing medication they can seek re-entry the next day.
