Healing like broken pottery...after trauma

We may all be familiar with the traditional idea of trauma, but the realm of trauma is expanding and we are learning more about the extent of trauma within our lives that may not feel so directly connected to what we experience day-to-day.

Intergenerational Trauma- a psychological term referring to the transfer of trauma between generations - to put this into context, trauma influencing you can extend as far back as 2 generations and the experienced trauma at that time. It can be difficult to tie certain behaviors or patterns to this form of trauma because the connection may not be clear or presenting.

What Intergenerational Trauma can affect/inflict on the Family:



- Unresolved emotions or thoughts about traumatic event
- Negative repeated patterns of behavior, including beliefs about parents
- Untreated or poorly treated substance abuse or severe mental illness
- Poor parent-child relationships and emotional attachment
- Complicated personality traits or personality disorders
- Content attitude with the way things are within the family, not striving to change



Even through our traumas, there is still hope through our growth and healing. Our faults and damage is what makes us who we are, but we do not need to remain in pieces. It is beautiful to embrace and work through difficulties instead of suppressing their existence. To get through it, we must repair and embrace new.
